## Cameron Hospital Plans Progressing

Angola, Indiana

LandPlan Group was awarded the site design contract for improvements at Cameron Memorial Community Hospital in Angola. The Hospital's site improvements include vehicular and pedestrian circulation studies, plazas, arrival court, gateway features, a healing garden, and a campus-wide planting plan. The creative design provides a consistent flow from outdoor to indoor spaces through careful planning and selection of construction materials.

## Maplecrest Streetscape Design

Fort Wayne, Indiana

Maplecrest Road's conversion from a two-lane connector to a four-lane arterial road is currently in the design development process. LandPlan Group is one of the design team members providing services for the City's INDOT TE-21 funded project. LandPlan's objective for the project is to provide a context-sensitive design solution utilizing a creative approach in the highly residential area. Gateways, pedestrian safety zones, corridor and boulevard plantings and vertical specialty enhancements are important design aspects of the project.

## Wabash Wayfinding Design Completed

Wabash, Indiana

Via Wayfinding, a LandPlan Group and The Baldus Company collaboration, recently wrapped up wayfinding signage system design solution for the City of Wabash, Indiana. The phase one project encompasses destinations within the Historic Downtown. Wabash's tag line "First Electrically Lighted City in the World" and "The Wabash Light" are key inspirations for developing the design theme.

Via Wayfinding worked directly with the Wabash Marketplace on the project, and has developed a design that visually adheres to the Historic Downtown Wabash. The color combinations selected provide both a historic appearance and easily readable signage system. The sign poles selected mimic the vintage-style light poles found throughout the downtown.
